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I hope that you are all well. Autumn is definitely upon us now and sadly the trees are beginning to lose their leaves.

It is wonderful to see so many of you on the gate in the morning or in the afternoon. St Mary's is such a lovely school and the children are all great. I really enjoy seeing their smiles at the beginning and end of the day. Thank you to all of you who have made me feel so welcome, I really look forward to my trips to Falmouth.

I really wanted to give you an update on all that is happening at St Mary's. Mrs Shailes is doing an amazing job of standing in for me when I am not here, she is extremely conscientious and wants the very best for the school and the children and this is so evident in her whole persona and the way she leads. I have every confidence in her as a leader.

The children are all settled back into their learning and really enjoying the topics that they are learning about this half term. The children in Year 1 and 5 are enjoying their time with their new teachers and we must give our new teachers a huge round of applause for working so hard in their first term.

We have reinstated the **behaviour principles** and hope to share with you our behaviour policy as soon as we can. We aim to work in partnership with you, drawing on **positive behaviour** styles to ensure all children do their best at all times and are rewarded for this.

Every week we will be holding a celebration assembly and each week two children from every class will be nominated as 'Stars of the Week' and receive a certificate for their positive attitude to learning, always trying their best, being respectful to others and generally going above and beyond. Alongside this we also have the **golden headteachers award which** is given to a child from each class for 'living' our **Gospel value** of the week. We will be focusing on a value each week and will be expecting all our children to demonstrate this value in some way not matter.

Drop offs are working really well and we are pleased that everyone is getting used to coming into school confidently every day. Please can I remind you about parking at the beginning of the day, bear in mind other road users and also pedestrians when choosing where to park. Please keep the entrance to the turning circle clear so that one of our pupils can get through to the school gate area.

Pick ups are working well with EYFS, Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 parents walking around to the classes to pick up their children. Year 4, 5 and 6 walk out at 3.30 independently.

We are considering cutting the end of the day by 10 minutes for the KS2 children which would mean a staggered exit of 5 minutes between **3.15 for EYFS and KS1 and 3.20 for KS2.** This time would be cut from their lunchtime so KS2 would have 50 minutes instead of an hour. This would also help with lunchtime supervisory cover. We would like to know your thoughts; if you are concerned about this change at the end of the day and do not want the end of day to change from **3.30 please let us know.** Our teachers are happy to change this end time of the day to **3.20pm** 

Clubs are now reinstated and I hope that your child has opportunity to attend the club of their choice.

Teaching and Learning is being reviewed to ensure all children are having access to areas of the curriculum which they may have missed due to the various lockdowns. We are really pleased with our children at St Mary's, every day they face new learning and new challenges and they certainly rise to the expectation. Hats of to you all for your continued support.

#### Next steps:

We aim to introduce Read, Write Inc phonics scheme that is complimented with Read, Write Inc reading books. Staff training (2<sup>nd</sup> half of the Autumn term) will focus on implementation so please do watch this space for accessing support materials to use at home.

We are also reviewing our curriculum ensuring it is broad and balanced in every way to guarantee every child reaches their full potential.

We have also reviewed our mission and vision statement that underpins everything we do at St Mary's.

After half term we will continue to refine our curriculum to ensure it is the very best offer in all subject areas of the national curriculum.

#### Uniform and clothes appropriate for school

As we begin a new academic year I just wanted to remind you about our uniform. The children are required to wear their uniform daily except when it is a PE day. The uniform needs to include the school jumpers, shirts and tie, trousers, shorts or skirts and smart shoes. Please do not wear trainers into school unless it is a PE day. For the PE uniform, please ensure your child is wearing the correct uniform too. This includes shorts, T-shirt and suitable trainers or plimsols. We may ask you to provide a black or navy tracksuit for colder days as we try and get the children outside for PE as much as we can. Please do not encourage your child to wear alternative clothing and branded clothing if possible and please can children have darker trainers in line with our uniform requirements.

## Masks

Although national guidance is that masks no longer need to be worn, public health have requested that staff continue to wear masks in communal areas in the school and when on the gates outside for meeting and greet and pick-ups. This recommendation will continue for the foreseeable future.

## Track and Trace

Track and trace will now be undertaken by NHS England. The usually procedures apply, if your child has symptoms call NHS 111 or 119 and ask for advice. They will suggest a PCR. Your child must not attend school whilst they are displaying these symptoms. Please be aware that the symptoms for Coronavirus are:

- High temperature- hot to touch on the forehead and the back
- Continuous cough or a persistent cough

Loss of smell or taste

If in doubt contact NHS 111/ 119 or your local GP surgery

If you think your child has symptoms please inform the school immediately, you will be advised to get a test. One you have your test results, please let the school know.

If there is a positive case in one of our classes, we will work with Public health Cornwall to trace the children who have had immediate contact with a child who has tested positive. Those children identified will be required to isolate for 10 days.

## Remote learning

As we move forwards to the winter months, there may be times when your child may have to work remotey. There are many links on our website that will help you with this. The teachers will also schedule live learning through Showbie/ Google meet and Google classroom.

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# Attendance

All schools are required by law to monitor attendance of their pupils over the year. This is reported to the DFE on a weekly, termly basis, yearly basis. Please can I politely remind parents and carers that I am unable to authorise holidays during term time. These periods of absence will be recorded as G (family holiday). I am very conscious of the number of children who are persistently absent and I know it is a challenging situation as COVID remains very prevalent in our lives however please can I ask you to make sure children attend school every day. It is so important for their wellbeing, their socialising and their learning that they try to attend on a daily basis. If you are struggling in any way, please let us know and we will put in place actions to help you and your child or children.

I would like to say a huge thank you to you all, these times continue to be strange for everyone but I can say with a full heart that it is truly wonderful to be able to welcome back all the children to school as well as those who are coming into our school for their first time.


