Lent 2021

Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, 17th February. Mass will be celebrated at 10.00 am at Falmouth. There will be the traditional blessing of the Ashes. However, the ashes will not be distributed in the usual way. This year the ashes will not be placed on your heads but rather sprinkled on your heads in silence, as you approach the priest as you would for holy communion.

Stations of the Cross

Each Friday of Lent at 6.30 pm Father Brian will lead the Stations of the Cross. Again, because of current restrictions this will be live-streamed using the 'Live Mass' link on the parish website. To help you participate Father Brian will use the Saint Alphonsus Stations of the Cross every week. Booklets of this stations will be available in the church at Falmouth so please feel free to take one home with you and keep it. We have 29 booklets for people to take. Please join us if you can.

First Holy Communion preparation

My sincere apologies to all the children and their families who were due to make their First Holy Communion last year and to those who put down their names. Unfortunately, due to the current lockdown we have been unable to hold the necessary preparation meetings. The good news is that our parish hall will be ready when the current restrictions are lifted and meetings will be able to take place keeping to the required social distancing.

Mark's Gospel

This liturgical year it is Mark's Gospel that we read each Sunday. It is the earliest and also the shortest of the Gospels with only 16 chapters. Therefore, I invite you to read and reflect on the Gospel of Mark during the holy season of Lent. I believe it will be very fruitful and a good preparation for Easter.

The Bishops Speak Out

On the 22nd January the **Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons** came into being. The Bishops of England and Wales have issued the following statement;

"This is a historic milestone on the path to nuclear disarmament. We urge support for the treaty and repeat our call for the UK to forsake its nuclear arsenal. At the same time, we implore the government to strengthen its arms control regulation, tackling the manufacture and sales of other weapons which continue to destroy so many lives throughout the world."

Pope Francis reminds us; "International Peace and Stability, cannot be based on a false sense of security or the threat of mutual destruction or total annihilation."

"A Precious Place of God's Grace"

Since it was issued on 1 November 2020, "*A Precious Place of God's Grace*", on the development of the pastoral structures in our diocese over the next five years and beyond, has rightly generated a lot of interest amongst our clergy and laypeople, with a number of individuals and parish groups having already fed back their initial thoughts. However, the on-going Covid-19 restrictions have impeded parish communities from being able to engage fully and widely with the document and its accompanying Parish Self-Assessment Tool. Therefore, in order to ensure that the important voice and views of our laypeople and parish communities are heard in this process of discernment, "*A Precious Place of God's Grace*" will be relaunched, with the Parish Self-Assessment Tool, when lockdown restrictions are eased. I hope in this way, we can hear from as many people as possible. Anyone in the diocese is still welcome to send any feedback directly to Canon Kristian Paver (kristian.paver@prcdtr.org.uk), who is collating it on behalf of myself and the Bishops Council. Please also note Saturday 1st May in your diaries, when an online event for Clergy and faithful in the Diocese, on "*A Precious Place*", will be facilitated by Michael Dopp, Director of the International Summit on the New Evangelisation. Further details will be sent out by the Vicariate for Evangelisation and Catechesis soon.
