## CAN YOU IMAGINE SLEEPING ON THE FLOOR EVERY NIGHT ?



It's hard to believe that in this day and age, there are children who do not have a warm and comfy bed to sleep in every night ! In fact, one in five children living in the south west are living in poverty, and in parts of the region poverty is even more severe. Some areas in our Diocese actually fall into the top 10% of the most deprived areas in England.



As part of our Good Shepherd programme, this Christmas The Catholic Children's Society (Plymouth) is asking children living in our Diocese to think of children less fortunate than themselves by putting themselves in their shoes just for one night. We are asking children living in Devon, Cornwall and parts of Dorset to give up their bed for one night to sleep on the floor.

If 100 children could raise £10 each in sponsorship, CCSP could buy beds and mattresses for 10 children, so they never have to sleep on the floor again.

Christians Against Poverty is a debt counselling centre in partnership with St Budock Church, in association with other local churches in Falmouth, Penryn & Surrounding Villages.

CAP's debt counselling service focuses on providing a service which works well for those who are more vulnerable and who need support to help them gain freedom from their debts. Their service is completely free.

Due to COVID – 19 they are currently temporarily replacing their face to face home visit debt counselling service with a telephone service, or a face to face church based appointment. Their service is holistic and they give clients the time they need over the phone or in person.

To access their church based face to face appointments, clients need to be able to travel to the appointment venue and bring their documentation with them.

Their local service will cover the following main postcodes in the area:

TR10, TR11 & TR3 7
