

Christians Against Poverty is a debt counselling centre in partnership with St Budock Church, in association with other local churches in Falmouth, Penryn & Surrounding Villages.

CAP's debt counselling service focuses on providing a service which works well for those who are more vulnerable and who need support to help them gain freedom from their debts. Their service is completely free.

Due to COVID – 19 they are currently temporarily replacing their face to face home visit debt counselling service with a telephone service, or a face to face church based appointment. Their service is holistic and they give clients the time they need over the phone or in person.

To access their church based face to face appointments, clients need to be able to travel to the appointment venue and bring their documentation with them.

Their local service will cover the following main postcodes in the area:

TR10, TR11 & TR3 7

CAP would be delighted to speak to anyone suffering with debt locally. Any prospective clients from the above post-codes should call 0800 328 0006 (our lines are open 9.30am-5.00pm Monday to Thursday and 9.30am-3.30pm on Fridays.
