# **A VERY WARM WELCOME**

to all who are worshipping with us today.

There is coffee or tea after mass on Sundays in the church hall at Helston;

We are gradually moving back more and more to the ways things were pre-pandemic. We are now using the Catholic Publishing Company's "Jerusalem" mass sheets for Sundays. These are slightly different from the "Emmaus" sheets we used pre-pandemic in that they contain more of the mass, and mass cards are not needed. If there is a general feeling that the Emmaus sheets were better suited for us we can change back at any time, but we need to let CPS know by 10<sup>th</sup> July for the next distribution.

THERE ARE NO MORE DAILY MASS SHEETS. As in prepandemic, days, the daily antiphons will be provided for congregational use, but if you wish to follow the readings, etc. you will need to bring a daily missal, If you have an "old" (pre 2010) daily missal for the most part the readings won't have changed, it's only the mass that's different. Or you could use an e-reader (on tablet or mobile phone). There are even a few of these available to borrow on request.

The next occasion will be to plan a Summer BBQ (on Sept. 1st) to thank Father Paul for his Ministry here in Helston.
