HELSTON & MULLION NEWS

The congregations of both our churches will be sad to hear of the death on Tuesday of one of our long-standing church members, **Isobel Ellis** of North Corner, Coverack. Isobel recently went into hospital in Treliske then Newquay with a broken tibia. She returned home last Sunday week, very weak. She had been anointed on the Monday, and church friends had visited her throughout the week. Last Saturday a little group of them sang hymns around her bedside, which she greatly enjoyed; and she received communion again last Sunday.

Isobel will be received into St Mary's church, Helston at 4 o'clock on Tuesday afternoon, 6th October, and the Funeral Mass will be at 11 o'clock on Wednesday, to be followed by interment in Coverack churchyard. Sadly, as you know, attendance at all funerals is limited to 30 people, but the usual church seating limits will apply on Tuesday afternoon, and there is no restriction to the burial, as it is outside.

Because of the restrictions on Wednesday, there will be a mass as usual at 12 noon on Thursday. Father Paul will take the Monday of that week as his day off.

This weekend we celebrate the mass "In thanksgiving for the Harvest" at Mullion and Helston; but in view of the present restrictions there are no special decorations in the Church. Perhaps instead you might like to make an extra donation to the CAFOD Harvest Fast Day appeal on Friday of this week, 2nd October.

Congratulations to **Bruce Kirkland** who received the Sacrament of Confirmation at the mass of St Thérèse of Lisieux last Thursday. This was deferred from earlier in the year because of the lockdown.

There seems to be some confusion as to whether use of the **track and trace QR codes** are compulsory in churches. They are at the entrances to both our churches anyway for those who wish to use them.

The **PAF Grant Memorial Magnolia Tree** was planted on Saturday evening. At Caroline's wish, PAF's ashes were interred at the same time. We shall bless the tree after mass on Sunday morning.

Jane Trevaskis has kindly offered to take on the administration of the **Memorial Garden** for ashes (or "cremains" as I believe we should now call them!). A map will shortly be drawn up, so if you would be interested in pre-booking a place let me or Jane know.

Paper towel dispensers have been fitted in our sacristies and the hall toilets and kitchen, ready for when we do (eventually) re-open. The latest restrictions sadly seem to push that even further into the future.
