Household bedding (bed sheets, pillow cases and duvet covers)


We will be there to collect in the morning on Friday 1st, Monday 4th and Tuesday 5th of July. Thank you for your support.



Thank you to all of our parents who are now using Parent Pay to book their child's school dinners., Breakfast Club and school trips.

You can book school dinners on the day up to the 8.30am cut off point. It means so much time is saved in class and teachers can start the school day. You can also cancel your dinner booking up to 8.30am on the day if your child is absent

Please make sure you have funds in your account when you book., if you have children in KS2.



Attendance

We are seeing a number of pupils arriving late for school in the morning. Please ensure that your child has arrived at school by 8.55 by the very latest so they do not get a late mark. Some children have lost nearly 5 hours learning time over the year due to repeated lateness. Our gates close at 8.55 and lessons begin at 9.00 am prompt.

Arriving late to school can be unsettling for pupils and may mean that your child misses important information given at the start of the day as well as disrupting the learning of the whole class.

If you child is absent from school please phone and leave a message on the absence line by 9.15am, teachers are unable to check their Dojo messages all of the time. If you haven't left a message and we don't know where they are, please expect a phone call and possibly a house visit if there is no response.

The government's White paper has been released. All schools from September 23 will need to increase the day to 32.5 hours a week. There will be a consultation on the school day in the Autumn term to see where we can increase this, it could be that we would start the day at 8.45 am to ensure we get the full hours into our working week.

Attendance will be reported to you when you receive the child's report at the end of the term. If you have any worries about the attendance of your child at the school please let me know via Dojo or email.
