The picture in front of the altar at Helston is a depiction of Our Lady of Sorrows from the Franziskaner Parish in Krakow, Poland, by Magdalena Walulik, it is a reminder of September's traditional devotion to **The Seven Sorrows of Mary,** as the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows falls on Tuesday this week, the day after the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on 14th. The Sorrows are: the prophecy of Simeon, the flight into Egypt, the loss of the Holy Child at Jerusalem for three days, meeting Jesus on his way to Calvary, standing at the foot of the Cross, Jesus being taken from the Cross, and the burial of Christ.

The Diocese has suggested the weekend of 26/27 September for Harvest

Thanksgiving. Unless anyone can see any problems with that, that is the weekend we shall use in Helston & Mullion.

Season of Creation - Pope Francis

September 1st – October 4^{th 2020} (Feast of St Francis)

Pope Francis has established Sept 1st as World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. Encouraging the Catholic Community around the world to pray for our common home.

Pope Francis offers a profound reflection on respect for the earth, its resources, the evils caused by man's greed and the need for 'restorative justice', such as debt cancellation for poor countries

In his message, the Pope notes that "the pandemic has brought us to a crossroads". "We must use this decisive moment", he says, "we must examine our habits of energy usage, consumption, transportation and diet. We must eliminate the superfluous and destructive aspects of our economies, and nurture life-giving ways to trade, produce, and transport goods"

The Pope admits, "we are aware that the cries of the earth and of the poor have become even louder and more painful in recent years. Yet it is a reason for joy to witness how the Holy Spirit is bringing individuals and communities around the world together to rebuild our common home and defend the vulnerable". Prayer

During this Season of Creation, strengthen us Creator God with the faith to trust in your providence. Inspire us with the creativity to share what we have been given. Teach us to be satisfied with enough. As we proclaim a jubilee for the Earth, send Your Holy Spirit to renew the face of creation.
