EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSURE PROCEDURES

A reminder of the emergency school closure procedure is as follows. We strongly recommend that you listen to updates on BBC Radio Cornwall, Pirate FM or Heart FM for up to date information on school closures which will also be posted on the radio stations websites. We will endeavour to contact all parents via the Schoolcomms system. This system sends a message to parent's mobile phones. If you have recently changed your mobile number, please inform the school office.

In the event for example of heavy snow during the school day, you the parents are in the best position to assess the road conditions etc. where you live. If you need to collect your child early then this is acceptable. The school will remain open until all pupils have been collected.

School Uniform

High expectations in all aspects of school life are a hallmark of our school and this includes wearing the specified school uniform. So many people in the wider community have commented on how smart our pupils look and I would like to thank you all for your efforts in sending your child/ren so smartly dressed in school uniform.

A small minority however are consistently arriving with no ties, leggings instead of tailored trousers, inappropriate footwear and colourful bows in their hair (very beautiful) but which are not in line with our uniform policy.

Details of the correct uniform are included in this newsletter edition, as after half term we will be carefully monitoring this and letters will be sent home if pupils are not wearing the correct uniform. Hopefully the half term period will give you time to sort uniform if your child is missing for example their tie.

The school uniform is as follows:

BOYS

- White shirt long sleeve shirt/short sleeve shirt for the Summer months
- Grey tailored trousers or shorts
- Royal Blue V Neck Jumper
- Clip on or Elastic School Tie
- Black or brown leather shoes (no trainers)
- Grey socks
- Royal Blue PE T Shirt
- Navy PE Shorts
- Long hair tied back

GIRLS

- White shirt long sleeve shirt/short sleeve shirt for the Summer months
- Grey skirts or pinafore dresses or grey tailored trousers or shorts
- Royal Blue V Neck Jumper
- Clip on or Elastic School Tie
- Black or brown shoes (no trainers)
- White socks or grey tights
- Royal blue head bands or school scrunchies
- Royal Blue PE T Shirt
- Navy PE Shorts
- Plimsolls (preferable laceless for infants)
- Long hair tied back
- No jewellery or nail polish is permitted.

Please note that pupils must wear only school caps for easy identification on trips and protection from the sun.

A strong bag to hold PE kit is needed too and all uniform should be labelled.

PE KIT

An increasing number of pupils are arriving in school without their PE kit. This then means they miss their PE lesson as we don't encourage borrowing kit from children in other classes. Pupils have been reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure they have their PE kit in school at all times. Your support in this matter is greatly appreciated.

MUSIC PROVISION

Last term parents were surveyed about contributions towards Music provision across the school. In the past the school has funded the whole class brass, ukulele and violin lessons as well as funding the cost of the instruments. This provision will be extended to include the Reception Class and Class 1 who will also have specialist music teachers to support their development from March. After half term Class 5 will also have a specialist teacher to teach music through technology.

As explained, the school can no longer continue to fund this provision. To date, a few parents have contributed on Parent Pay for these enhanced lessons from some classes but not all. Can I gently remind parents that the small voluntary contribution of £1 per lesson for one child and those families with more than one child, 75p per child per session is paid as soon as possible to ensure the success of the pilot and continued specialist music provision. Details of when payments need to be made for those classes who haven't started these sessions (Reception, Class 1 and Class 5) will be sent out before half term. I'd like to thank those who have already started to contribute.
