#### VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

A few parents have asked for clarity around 'Voluntary Contributions'. This is what the Education Act 1996 says about voluntary contributions.

Schools cannot charge for certain activities, but they can request or invite "voluntary contributions for the benefit of the school or any school activities".

If a school requests a voluntary contribution, it must make it clear that:

- There is no obligation to contribute.
- Pupils will not be treated differently according to whether or not their parents have contributed.

The law on charging in schools is set out in Sections 449 to 462 of the Education Act 1996.

#### In addition please note:-

Where the school cannot levy charges and it is not possible to make these additional activities within the resources ordinarily available to the school, the school may request or invite parents to make a contribution towards the cost of the trip or activity. Pupils will not be treated differently according to whether or not their parents have made any contribution in response to the request or invitation. However, where there are not enough voluntary contributions to make the activity possible, then it will not take place.

Please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Scarborough if you require any further information, or indeed in confidence if your family has difficulty making payments.
