Harry D'Silva was an inspirational and well respected Headteacher. He was appointed head at St Mary's school in 1980 and retired at Christmas in 2003. He was a larger than life character who was loved by staff, past pupils and parents alike. He was also very popular amongst his peers, many of whom looked to him for guidance and advice.

He was extremely gifted and talented and his creativity and love of the arts filtered through the school and gave life to all areas of the curriculum.

His down to earth, infectious personality had such a highly positive impact on everybody he came into contact with. He will be sadly missed by everyone. Those that had the good fortune to work with him were blessed to have worked for such an amazing and charismatic leader.

Harry once said to me: 'They say we die twice. The second time is when the last person alive who knew us ceases to tell our story.' Harry's story will continue to be told for a very long time by all those whose lives he touched.

We have parents who will remember Harry when they were pupils here or whose older children attended St Mary's. With this in mind, if you would like to write a message and sign a book of remembrance available in the school foyer, we will pass this onto the D'Silva family in due course.

Education Welfare Officer (EWO) Visit

The EWO visited our school yesterday and scrutinised all registers. She picked up on a small number of pupils who are consistently late for school on a regular basis. From September, this will be monitored by the EWO closely and parents will initially be invited to one of our Attendance Clinics. If the situation doesn't improve, we have been informed action will be escalated and in extreme cases may result in court proceedings.

It is extremely disruptive and inconsiderate to other learners and the teacher when children are consistently arriving late. Every minute late is logged on our management system and over a period of time, can equate to days of absence for some pupils.

Collecting your child/ren promptly at the end of the school day is equally important, particularly after clubs as staff have other commitments. Once again, it is most inconsiderate to expect teaching staff to supervise children whose parents arrive late to collect them. We completely understand that on isolated occasions, e.g due to road works or other issues, you might be late collecting your child. However, if you are consistently late, then the matter will be escalated.

Porthpean Trip - Year 6

Once again our year 6 pupils had a fantastic time at their residential camp at Porthpean. They always remember their experience over the 3 days which seems to always supersede their experience of the last seven years at St Mary's! 3. **Falmouth Library** are again taking part in the Summer Reading Challenge.

Every year, thousands of families take part in the UK's biggest reading event for children in libraries, run by the charity 'The Reading Agency'. The Challenge combines **FREE** access to books with fun, activities in the library during the summer holidays.

Throughout the Challenge, library staff and volunteers support children, helping them to discover new authors and to explore a wide range of different types of books and ways of reading.

The aim is to get children to read any **6** books of their choice from their library during the summer holidays.

Every year there's a different theme. The Summer Reading Challenge 2018 is called **Mischief Makers**, inspired by the much-loved iconic children's title Beano, which celebrates its 80th anniversary.

The Summer Reading Challenge is aimed at children aged 4 to 11.

1. Children sign up at their local library and receive a Mischief Makers collector poster.
2. Children borrow and read at least six library books of their own choice during the summer, collecting special stickers to complete their poster and incentives along the way.
3. Library staff and young volunteers are on hand to advise and run family-friendly activities.
4. Children who complete the Summer Reading Challenge are presented with a medal on completion and a certificate.

The Challenge on starts on Saturday 14th July and finishes on Saturday 8th September 2018
