Dear Parents

Firstly, thank you all for the incredible support, understanding and commitment you have shown St Mary's in the first half of the academic year. We are all looking forward to an exciting half term in the build up to Christmas.

I'm happy to report that the children have had a great week at school and they have all been really focussed on their learning. The children have even started learning their Christmas songs!

As you are all well aware we are unfortunately still having to deal with COVID-19 on an ongoing basis. We are doing our upmost to ensure your child's safety while also making sure that they are happy in school. We are in contact with Public Health Cornwall daily, following their advice to make sure that the school remains open. Their advice remains that any children who are poorly remain at home until they are well and if someone in your household has tested positive, you will need to access a PCR to check if you or your child/children are infected too. They have also advised that at times LFTs are not accurate so using a PCR can provide a more reliable result.


MONDAY 15TH NOVEMBER IS ODD SOCKS DAY!
