Elsie performed with Cornwall Youth Choir at the prestigious Music for Youth National Festival in Birmingham Symphony Hall.



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

Dear Parents/Carers

Important School Meals Information – Parent School Meal Pre-Ordering Launch!

At Plymouth CAST, we believe and recognise that partnership is the key to the future of a sustainable service, working with children, schools and families to improve nutrition, health and education.

Food plays a significant part in a young person's development and we wanted to support you with a flexible approach to menu selections as well as ensuring children receive the meals they like. To support families and schools in this aim, we are introducing a new meal pre-ordering service as part of your new ParentPay account.

Pre-ordering of meals can be made from your ParentPay account, allowing you and your child(ren) to select their school meals and manage meal payment easily.

From 18/08/2025 the system will be live to allow you to pre-book your child's school meals for week commencing 1<sup>st</sup> September 2025. Please do not book any meals for September before this date as they will be cancelled and you will be required to rebook.

Starting from September, we will no longer be accepting any cash payments for school dinners, and all meal bookings must be made online via ParentPay. If a booking has not been made in advance, they will be offered an option of either a Jacket Potato or Tomato Pasta for that day. This meal will be recorded and charged accordingly on ParentPay. We therefore strongly encourage all parents to sign up for ParentPay and make meal bookings in advance to ensure pupils receive their preferred choice of meal.

Please read the following information carefully as it confirms all the details you need to know. All school payments, including lunches, must be paid for by ParentPay. ParentPay is a safe and secure website which allows you to make payments online with your debit/credit card.

Free School Meals and Universal Infant Free School Meals - For parents of children in reciept of free meals, you will also need to pre-order your child's meals through ParentPay, but you will not be charged.

Packed Lunch Children - We are also asking all Parents/Carers whose children usually bring their own packed lunch to sign up too - for those odd occasions that packed lunches are forgotten or you want them to have an ad-hoc dinner, for example on a theme day such as World Book Day.

Dietary Requirements - Special menus for children with dietary requirements are currently being inputted onto the system. If these choices are not showing on your child's account when you log on, your child will still be able to order from their special menu in the school office until their choices are updated.
