We are passionate about developing and promoting the Arts through an enjoyable, creative and cross curricular approach. As well as focussed high quality teaching of the National Curriculum Programs of Study in classes, we enrich our children's learning and experiences of the Arts through a range of school time and after school specialist club opportunities.

We are also committed to providing opportunities for our pupils to share and perform their abilities and talents in the Arts both during a range of events in school and in the wider community. Arts teaching within the taught curriculum

In both Key Stages the arts are taught both explicitly and through a creative cross curricular, thematic approach to learning.

Assessment and Reporting

Learning outcomes are identified for each lesson. Pupils are made aware of the learning outcomes for all lessons through Can I ... learning questions. Assessment in the arts can take various forms:

Pupils' progress in the arts is reported regularly through consultation with parents, and annual reports. Assessment of the arts is monitored through assessment tracking grids which are updated termly against the national curriculum attainment targets, in drama the level descriptors have been taken from the "Drama in schools" publication produced by the Arts Council.
