

## Online risks:

Oversharing Children and young people can sometimes feel pressure to overshare online. Remind them that they shouldn't share private things, such as:

- personal information, like names, phone numbers, links to other social media accounts or their school
- live or frequent locations
- other people's personal information
- links to join private group chats

photos of themselves, photos of their body

## Sharing their location

Many apps and games give you the option to share your location. You should help children think about how and when they're sharing it.

Some of the ways they may be likely to share location include:

- tagging photos with the geo-location · checking into venues
- sharing journeys
- location settings on your child's device

sharing images or videos that contain street names etc. If shared publicly, their location could be seen by someone they don't know. People could find out where they live or go to school, allowing an accurate picture of their daily routine to be built up.
