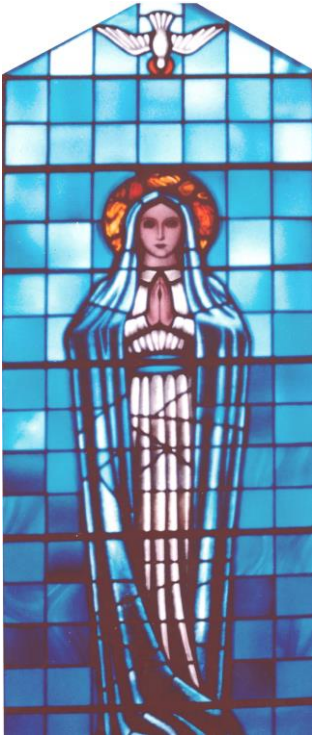

Also, as we are now able to have an Offertory Procession, but not a collection in the seats, please put your offering in the basket on the way **IN** to church from now on. Although all other sheets can go in the recycling box, to save paper please put these

new mass leaflets in the wire tray as they can be re-used after 48 hours in quarantine.
