Greetings from St Peter's Major Seminary!

Please extend our regards to all benefactors who are helping us.

Covid-19 has been a challenge in Malawi. Life was very tough in both

towns and villages. Our people were unable to support the Church very well and as a result, parishes and seminaries greatly suffered.

St Peter's Major Seminary was not spared. We have eight teaching Priests, but when the seminary suffered financially during the crisis, six Priests and all students were sent back to their dioceses. Only the Rector and the Bursar remained. Under normal circumstances, Priests serving in the seminaries are never sent back to their dioceses. The seminary could not manage to take care of its Priests during the crisis.

When we resumed normal classes, we were not stable financially and the only relief same from Missio in
