News from Drew and Exeter

University's Gull project

"My name is Drew and I am a masters student at the University of Exeter. I'm learning about the gulls that are up on the roof of St. Marys and other places in the local area.

I want to know if the parents behave differently when there are street lights shining near their nest. I have some boxes up near a few of the nests which can tell me about the lights, and cameras which will film the parents when they come to take care of the chicks!

On your roof we counted 17 nests and the youngest chicks are almost three weeks old now, they'll soon start growing some grown-up feathers and getting ready to fly!

I hope that I will have lots of nice videos of the gulls to share when I come back to check the cameras"
